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


We developed our school values a number of years ago.



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Uniform

Apart from items with the school logo uniform can be purchased in highstreet stores. Our colours are bottle green, black/grey and white and the uniform is as follows:

School bottle green sweatshirt/hoodie/cardigan with school logo and house White polo shirt

Grey/black trousers, skirt or shorts (green gingham dresses can be worn in the summer)

Black shoes

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On days your child has PE (Monday & Tuesday), they should wear their school jumper over their PE kit, which includes:

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School Day

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Learning

During each year we teach through five different topics, which have a historical or geographical focus, but also link to other subjects, such as English, computing, art, DT and music. The Year 3 topics are:

- Solid as a Rock The Stone Age and the Iron Age
- Extreme Earth volcanoes, earthquakes and tsunamis
- Look Out! The Romans are Coming! The Romans in Britain
- Let the Battle Commence The Anglo-Saxons
- I'm a pupil get me out of here! Rainforests



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Reading Books

At Wicklea we use Accelerated Reader for reading books.

Not Comparable to Reading Levels

Nationally recommended programme that allows teachers to monitor and manage children's reading.

After an initial assessment children pick a book within their ZPD and read it at their own pace.

When they complete a book they take a short online quiz in school.

Focuses on <u>understanding</u> and <u>enioving</u> what your child is reading.

Feedback from quizzes help children and teachers decide when you move up.

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Reading Books

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If you child did not reach the expected level in their phonics screening test then they will continue with the phonics programme and books until they have completed the whole programme.

They will have a school book at their phonics levels, an independent take home phonics book and a share together book.

Once they have competed the phonics programme they will take the Accelerated Reader test and change books.





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Regular reading – at least 3 times a week Maths skills – Times Tables Rockstars Spellings

Some open-ended projects over a few weeks linked to their topic or whole school project

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
